# **Field Trips**

On 12 December 2018, a field trip to The National Remote Sensing Centre Outreach facility (a premier institution of the ISRO), was organised for the Lemurs of grades 9 & 10.

It was an educative experience for the Epistemo Lemurs, as they had the opportunity to learn about airplanes, rockets, satellites, planets





etc. The students were

introduced to platforms of remote sensing, geostationary orbits, active & passive sensors and different departments of space.

It was a day well spent, and the children came back with a better understanding of satellite and space technology.

The learners of grade 5 got the opportunity to visit The Akshaya Patra Foundation, a not-for-profit organisation feeding millions of under privileged children in India. They are committed to

eradicating two most critical issues and malnutrition hunger among children by implementing the Mid-Day Programme in Meal government governmentschools and aided schools. Carrying out the world's largest feeding programme, Akshaya Patra aims to not only fight hunger but bring children to school. also Telangana - they have a centralised kitchen in Hyderabad which reaches out to 62,020 children in 463 schools.





Lemurs of Grade 7 visited the Science and Technical Exhibition at GITAM University on 21 December 2018 as part of their field trip, and it not only served as an eye opener to science for our students, but also honed their communication and technology skills, and was a step forward towards their all-round

development.

#### **External Exams & Events**

174 students took part in the International Math Olympiad Exams conducted in school on 13 December (Thursday). The International Mathematical



Olympiad (IMO) is the largest and most prestigious Mathematics Olympiad for young geniuses. Olympiads are designed to encourage the learners to test their problem solving and application skills.

published in NIE in the current month.

### **CCA Activities:**

As a part of CCA activities various competitions were conducted in the month of December. Our Lemurs participated with full

enthusiasm and interest in various competitions like Christmas Greeting card making, Carol singing and Mock Parliament. The Mock Parliament gave students the opportunity to exhibit their thinking and



presentation skills, and was very well executed.

## **Experiential learning:**

The Lemurs of 8th grade did a hands-on activity to help them understand the concept of DNA in a fun and interesting way. Simple materials such as play dough, ribbons, straws and newspapers were used to create a 3D model of DNA strands and the protein blocks that form the



basis of human life. The models put up by the students were colourful and informative. Students went home with a renewed understanding of the science behind the creation of life.

#### **Student Achievers:**

Our student, Sidharth V Nair from grade 5B, won the National level radio jockey talent hunt which was conducted as a part Indywood film carnival in Hyderabad on 5 December 2018. He was awarded a trophy, certificate and a cash prize of Rs. 5000.

stood as Champion in India Tennis League organized at Sancta Maria International School.
