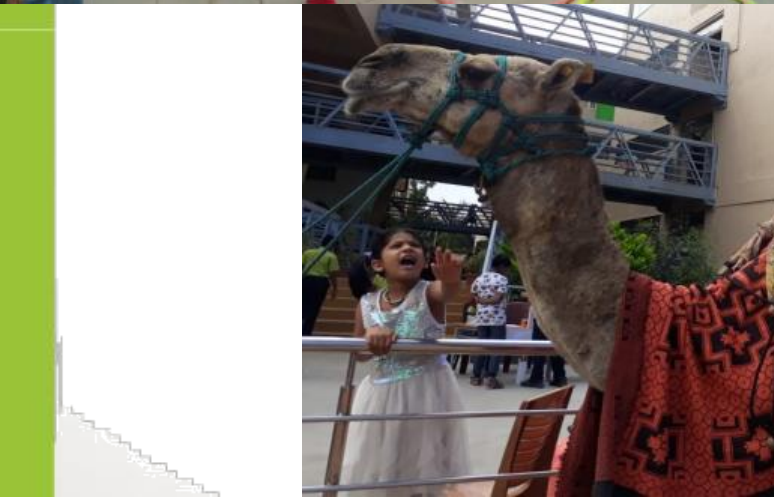

Epistemo Vikas Leadership School organised a 6 day long extravagant educational tour to Kerala- a pristine destination commonly referred to as God's own country from 29th September to 4th October, 2019. Around 70 students of different grades along with seven staff members attended this tour.

The students travelled via Go-Air flight on 29th September and de-boarded at Bengaluru – the first destination in the itinerary. They visited Sri Ranganathasway temple in Srirangapatnam en route to Mysore. They also visited Tipu Sultan Museum and Daria Daulta which was absolutely breathtaking.

Then, they proceeded to Wayanad and checked into BrookSide Resort that is located in Lakkidi, the peak in Wayanad, Kerala. The students visited the Tea Plantations and the Tea Manufacturing Factory and en-route, stopped at the Pookode lake for sight seeing.

The Tea Gardens were a sight to behold and the students made the most of it by clicking a lot of pictures. A drive along the road through Muthanga Jeep safari offered chances to watch various species of deer, monkeys, antelopes, bison, elephants and different birds.

The students also had hands-on experience in weaving, pottery sessions and had the opportunity to visit a farmer who cultivates and conserves indigenous varieties of paddy.

The kids had the opportunity to experience for themselves, the grandeur of Mysore's famous Dasara festival!. On 2nd October, the students visited Mysore Palace that was dazzlingly illuminated by almost 100,000 light bulbs and viewed the palace's magnificent Golden Throne that was assembled in the Durbar Hall. They started their journey back to Bengaluru on 3rd October. The students were immensely satisfied with this trip and enjoyed themselves to the core.









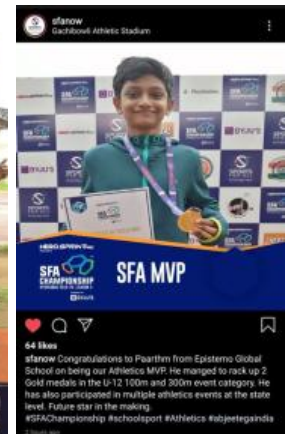

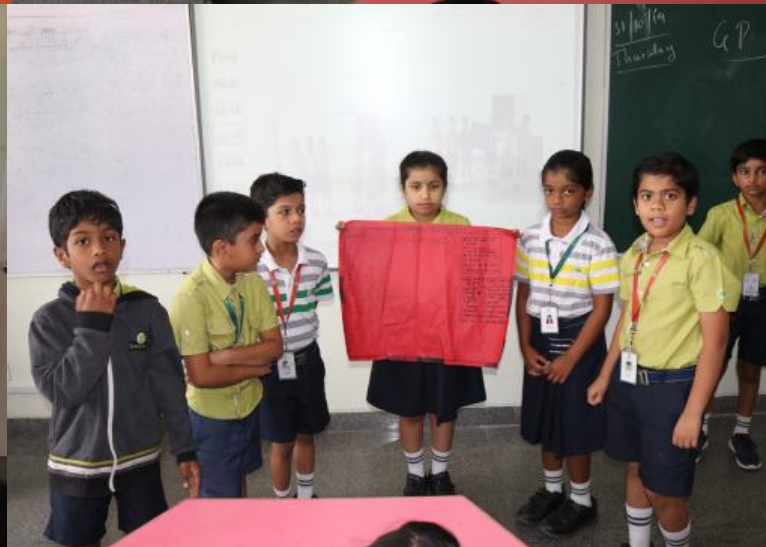




GP Reflection
